#### ST RICHARD'S – LATEST NEWS

We had a great time singing and praying together at our monthly prayer meeting on Thursday night. And what a joy to do so back together in the building! Ben shared a little more about the Thorndikes moving to Tonbridge and how that came about. We also talked about different possibilities for us as we seek to appoint the next Minister of St Richard's, and the planned discussion at PCC next week in light of responses from both St Richard's and All Saints church families so far. Ben will share all these things again on Sunday morning.

### SUNDAYS AT ST RICHARD'S

We hit the autumn term with the same freedoms to worship that we have enjoyed through the summer. Praise the Lord for that! If you are a regular member of the church family, you will know that our plan is to continue coming out of lockdown and social distancing gradually. We long to open up and do as much as we can together, but the overriding principle is a love and concern for others, especially those who feel less confident and more vulnerable than we might. So that said, a brief reminder of some of the things we are doing, and encouraging all of us to do together, over the coming weeks:

- We will still have hand sanitiser at the doors for you to use coming in and going out.
- Masks are not compulsory but please do wear a face covering if you would like (though we are asking everyone to wear one when we sing together).
- We will keep the building **ventilated** as much as possible, with windows open.
- Rows of **seating** remain spaced out a little more than usual but due to increasing numbers, we plan to add the extra row of seats on Sunday 19 September.
- As a courtesy please ask the person you plan to sit next to if they want you to leave a seat empty or not, and please, if you feel more comfortable with a seat between you and another household do say so to the person planning to sit next to you without any embarrassment. Consider this too, when sitting in front of, or behind, someone on the rows.
- We can **chat** in the building after a service, but if the weather is fine, we encourage you to chat outside.
- We continue to encourage people to **exit** via the back door into the outside space for the time being.
- We hope to reintroduce wine to **The Lord's Supper** this month in a safe manner more info to follow.
- We have made the decision to postpone serving refreshments on Sundays for a while longer as we consider how it works practically, especially as we try to gain normality of seating in the worship area. Vanessa Nicholls has kindly agreed to lead the team as we go forward. Apologies for this delay, but we do hope to have refreshments running again before the colder weather sets in!

- Car parking a couple of gentle reminders now we are getting busier on Sunday mornings:
- We have a number of people who struggle significantly with mobility, or who have small children to
  otherwise navigate across the busy road! Our musicians are sometimes carrying equipment too. Out of
  love for one another, please try to keep the parking bays at the front of church free for use by those who
  most need them.
- Also, when parking on the roads around, please do not park at the corner of junctions or across the
  pedestrian drop curbs for the sake of local residents. Please park respectfully and lovingly (and legally!) so
  that our Christian witness on the Alderbrook estate might not be damaged. It is probably worth an extra
  few seconds walk to guard these relationships.

#### OTHER NEWS...

- Road closure Walshes Road! South East Water plan to install 200m of new water main in Walshes Road, from July 26. The project is expected to take c.12 weeks to complete. Walshes Road will be closed for the duration in three sections: First, between Stone Cross Road and Walshes Road to the junction at Kingfisher Drive. Secondly, between Kingfisher Drive and Nightingales. Finally, between Nightingales and Luxford Road. This will impact traffic from the south, but the church is still accessible from the Whitehill Road end of Fermor Road. For more details see: https://corporate.southeastwater.co.uk/walshesroad
