The Electoral Roll count 2025

This year every parish in the Church of England is required to create a new Electoral Roll which means everyone who would like to be on it needs to apply to join. This is in preparation for the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) on 18th May. Being on the Roll enables you to vote at the APCM,



but more importantly is a way of saying you belong to our Church Family. You are eligible if you are baptised, and live in the parish or, if not in the parish, have been worshipping regularly with us for 6 months (unless unable to do so by illness).

8-11 April - 9am - 12.30pm, at All Saints.


